Several options to choose from:

Ladies and festivals of the Loire Valley:
Château of Chenonceau : Built in the 16th century, a true masterpiece of the French Renaissance, built on the peaceful waters of the Cher, the "Ladies' castle"
The Château of Amboise : Royal residence under the reigns of Kings Charles VIII and François I (late 15th-early 16th century).
The Clos Lucé-Parc Leonardo Da Vinci in Amboise : Last home of Leonardo da Vinci.

In the garden of France:
the Château of Langeais : Built in the mid-15th century, it marks an opening towards the Renaissance while retaining its feudal characteristics.

The Gardens of the Château of Villandry : one of the last great castles to be built in the Loire Valley during the Renaissance, on three levels.

The Château of Azay-le-Rideau : a masterpiece of 16th century architecture on an island of the river Indre with its romantic 19th century flowered park, a dreamlike journey ...

The must of the Loire Valley:
The Château of Chambord. More than 5 centuries after its construction, it still defies the imagination: 156 meters of facade, 56 meters high, 440 rooms ... François Ier wanted to build the most sumptuous hunting meeting that history has given us.

The château of Chenonceau. Built in the 16th C, a true masterpiece of the French Renaissance built on the peaceful waters of the Cher and known as the "Ladies' castle"
